



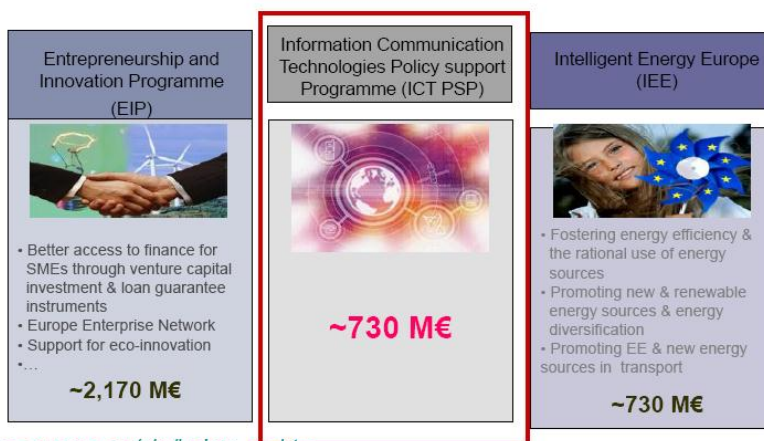

- *Key funding programme supporting the ICT Policy and the Digital Agenda for Europe*
 - **ICT PSP: To drive forward innovation through the wider uptake and best use of ICTs**
 - Complements ICT in FP7 that aims at strengthening Europe's leadership role in mastering and shaping the development of ICTs
- *ICT PSP: Three inter-linked goals (legal base)*
 - **Develop the Digital single market**
 - **Support innovation / wide adoption and investments in ICT**
 - **Improve quality of services and enable an inclusive Information Society**

ICT Policy Support Programme
The ICT Policy Support Programme aims at stimulating innovation and competitiveness.

The ICT Policy Support Programme (ICT PSP) is one of the three specific programmes of the Competitiveness and Innovation Exchange Programme (CIP) and runs for the years 2007-2013. The ICT PSP aims at stimulating smart sustainable and inclusive growth by encouraging the wider uptake and best use of innovative digital technologies and content by citizens, governments and businesses.

It provides EU funding to support the realisation of the digital agenda for Europe.

The programme addresses objectives that foster further and better use of ICT based products and services and business for the development of high-growth businesses, create SMEs in the field, by evidence-based illustrating and validating the high value of digital technologies for the economy and society. It will foster the development of Europe-wide solutions for innovations enabling cross-compare in Europe to benefit from the largest internal market in the world.

Particular emphasis is put on areas of public interest given their weight in the European economy and the unique solutions that ICT can bring to the essential challenges that we ahead with in health and ageing, education, energy efficiency, sustainable mobility, culture preservation and tourism as well as efficient public administration. The main challenges include the rapidly slow uptake of ICT innovation in the public sector and the high fragmentation of relevant markets due notably to a lack of interoperability between ICT solutions deployed across the Member States and associated Countries.
