



MARIE SKŁODOWSKA-CURIE ACTIONS

(MSCA) are something for you, if you...

- ... want to go to/return to Europe or an Associated Country, carrying out an individual research project at an excellent host organisation (academic or private sector)
- ... want to host excellent researchers **from Europe** or an Associated Country for the benefit of your research organisation

MSCA-Individual Fellowships (IF)* promote the career development of researchers undertaking international mobility

 ... want to establish or deepen co-operations with universities or companies in Europe or an Associated Country

MSCA-Research and Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE) promotes the international staff exchange

AIMS

"Expected impact" of the Individual Fellowships

- Enhance the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers through advanced training, international, interdisciplinary and intersectoral mobility
- Increase the set of skills, leading to improved employability and career prospects both in and outside academia
- Enhance cooperation and stronger networks
- Ensure a better transfer of knowledge between sectors and disciplines
- Increase international, interdisciplinary and intersectoral mobility of researchers



Choice of research topic

Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions follow the **bottom up** principle, you are free to chose the research/transfer of knowledge topic. Proposals will be evaluated in *8 scientific panels*.



Always keep the specific aim of the Fellowship in mind \rightarrow contribution of the fellowship to the career development of the most promising researchers

Beneficial to show the relevance of the research field for the European Research Area



Participants

Beneficiary \rightarrow **signatories** to the grant agreement with REA, always the host organisation in EU-MS/AC

Partner organisation \rightarrow non-signatory to the grant agreement. Host in the third country for Global Fellowships (e.g. US) or secondment host in Europe. Partner organisations in a Third Country for GF should provide letter of commitment to be included in the project proposal.

Fellow / Experienced Researcher \rightarrow non-signatory to the grant agreement, will be **employed by the host organisation** with the funds provided by the Fellowship



Who applies?

Experienced researcher in cooperation with the *host institution/beneficiary* (any legal entity in the academic or non-academic sector established in a European Union Member State or Associated Country (EU-MS/AC))

Sectors

academic sector \rightarrow public/private higher education establishments awarding academic degrees, public/private non-profit organisations whose primary mission is to pursue research, international European interest organisations

non-academic sector \rightarrow any socio-economic actor not included in the academic sector



Mobility

Geografical mobility: Fellows may not have lived/worked in host country for more than 12 months within the last 3 years prior to the deadline for the proposal submission \rightarrow *Mobility rule!*

For the *Global Fellowships*, the Mobility Rule applies only for the Third Country host organisation (not for the host organisation in the EU-MS/AC)



Mobility

Intersectoral mobility \rightarrow IFs allow for secondments within Europe, to gain inter-sectoral experience or to take advantage of expertise at other hosts from the same sector.

Secondments

- must be located in MS or AC
- optional: intersectoral mobility
- must significantly contribute to the impact of the fellowship
- must be clearly identified in Part B
- ➤ ≠ short visit

Duration of the Fellowship	Duration of the Secondment	
< 18 months	max. 3 months	
> 18 months	max. 6 months	



Who is funded?

Experienced researchers (ERs) \rightarrow either 4 years full time research experience after the degree that allows to embark on doctoral studies or **possession of** doctoral degree. Counting at the proposal deadline.



What is funded?

- Living- and extra expenses due to mobility and family status of Fellows
- Contribution to project costs (research-, training-, networking costs)
- Contribution to Management- und Overheadcosts

Contribution of fixed amounts in the form of *unit costs*. Units are the total of the funded months / duration of the Fellowship.



Structure of the contribution

* A correction coefficient is applied to the living allowance to reflect country specific conditions. For Austria: 104,8%, for the US: 99,4%

EUROPEAN FELLOWSHIPS

Requirements

- Experienced researchers can do their projects for 12-24 months in an EU-MS/AC
- ➤ Mobility rule! → Exceptions for Career Restart-, Reintegration- and Society and Enterprise-panels
- Researchers of all nationalities are eligible
- Contracts are signed between REA and the host institution





EUROPEAN FELLOWSHIPS

Career Restart (CAR)

Researchers may not have been active in research for at least 12 months immediately prior to the deadline

Reintegration (RI)

- For researchers with EU-MS/AC nationality that move or have moved from a TC (e.g. US) directly to the EU-MS/AC where the host is located
- Nationals of Third Countries are eligible, when they have previously spent a period of full-time research activity in a EU-MS/AC of at least 5 consecutive years

Society and Enterprise (SE)

The beneficiary must be an entity from the non-academic sector

Proposals are evaluated in separate, multidisciplinary panels





EUROPEAN FELLOWSHIPS

Special Mobility Rule for CAR, RI and SE

Researchers must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the country of the beneficiary for more than 36 months in the 5 years immediately before the call deadline.





GLOBAL FELLOWSHIPS

Requirements

- Experienced researchers (ER) from EU-MS/AC can do their projects for the duration of 12-24 months at a partner organisation in a third country
- Return phase in EU-MS/AC of 12 months is mandatory
- Agreements are signed between REA and the return host in the EU-MS/AC
- ER is employed by the host in the EU-MS/AC and seconded to the partner organisation in the third country
- Nationals of Third Countries are eligible, if they have spent a period of full-time research activity in an EU-MS/AC of at least 5 consecutive years



PIC – registration of the host organisation(s)


- Each participating organisation needs a PIC Participant Identification Code
- Organisations that participated in Horizon 2020 or FP7 already have a PIC \rightarrow search tool on the Participant Portal in the "Beneficiary Register"

 \succ If the host organisation is not yet registered \rightarrow

Legal Entity Appointed Representative (LEAR): Person who is nominated from the organisation; can change the data of the organisation and has an overview of all proposals

SUBMISSION

Some hints for SUCCESSFUL SUBMISSION...

- Each participating organisation needs a PIC Participant Identification Code → Ask your IF host organisation for it
- Use the current Guide for Applicants
- Download Part B template from the Participant Portal
- ➢ Play on the safe side → submit early, submit often it is technically possible; latest submitted version will be evaluated.
- Uploading the proposal (without clicking "submit") in the last moment invalidated the previous version – as the system replaces the old version.
- SUBMISSION IS OVER on 14th of SEPTEMBER 2017, 17:00:00 CET

Research and Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE)

- Project built on joint research and innovation activities
- Project implemented through the secondment of staff (no recruitments)
- > Each staff member seconded for a period of 1 to 12 months
- The maximum size for a project is 540 seconded person months
- No minimum size explicitly defined for the project, but substantial impact is expected
- Maximum project duration is 4 years



RISE IMPLEMENTATION MODALITIES

Consortium:

- At least 3 independent participants in 3 different countries and at least 2 of them from 2 different EU-MS/AC.
- If all in MS/AC: at least 1 academic and 1 non-academic

Modes:

- International staff exchanges between MS/AC and TC institutions (e.g. US)
- Intra-European staff exchanges between MS/AC academic institutions and MS/AC non-academic institutions
- \rightarrow Possible to combine the two modes!



RISE SPECIFICITIES: CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

Beneficiaries

- > Are established in a **EU-MS/AC**
- Sign the Grant Agreement and claim costs
- Are responsible for the execution of the programme

Partner Organisations

- > Are established in a **TC (e.g. US)**
- > Do **not sign** the Grant Agreement and do **not claim costs**
- Must include a letter of commitment in the proposal



RISE – COUNTRIES ELIGIBLE FOR EU FUNDING

In practise, this means that

- staff seconded from EU-MS/AC to US will be funded
- staff seconded from US to EU-MS/AC will NOT be funded

→ Partnership Agreement (a.o. to define the distribution of the funding budget, also to TC Partner Organisations)

In very exceptional cases, partners from Third Countries might be funded if

- a) This partner has competences/expertise that no organisation in MS/AC has
- b) The transfer of knowledge can only be done via a secondment $TC \rightarrow MS/AC$
- c) Points a) and b) must be endorsed by the expert evaluators
- d) The experts' endorsement (point c) must be confirmed by the REA



RISE – EU CONTRIBUTION

Unit costs per researcher per month of secondment

For secondments eligible for funding

	(person/month)	Research, training and networking costs	Management and overheads	
Research and Innovation Staff Exchange	2.000	1.800	700	

* Intended to support the travel, accommodation and subsistence costs linked to the respective secondments. Participants are expected to continue paying the salary of the seconded staff during the period of exchange.

The EU contribution must be fully used for the benefit of the seconded staff member.



RISE – CALL 2018

The RISE call 2018 will be published in the MSCA Work programme 18-20 \rightarrow expected in fall 2017
