

Aim:


- Protecting society and infrastructures against potential threats like crime, sabotage, terrorism and natural or man made disasters;
- **Developing novel technologies** that meet the needs of practitioners from law enforcement agencies, police authorities, forensic institutes, border guards, customs authorities, civil protection and first responders while respecting fundamental rights and assessing the societal impact of security technologies;
- Enabling society and security practitioners to react efficiently in case of crises and disasters.

Focus on civilian applications:

While actions under Horizon Europe should have an exclusive focus on civilian applications, synergies should be sought with the activities funded under the European Defence Fund.

Operators of Critical Infrastructure



- For most calls at least 3 partner organisations from 3 different EU or associated countries have to be involved. At least one of the 3 partners must be from an EU country. In addition, in some calls the involvement of practitioners (end-users and users of the project's results) is obligatory.
- Legal entities are eligible for funding if they are established in an EU Member State or to Horizon Europe associated country.*
- Article 22(5) of the Horizon Europe Regulation makes it possible to limit participation to legal entities established in Member States or in specified associated or other third countries.

^{*}Third countries not associated to Horizon Europe may receive funding in exceptional cases.

Identify, inspect, neutralise Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) at sea

HORIZON-CL3-2023-BM-01-02, RIA, €5 Mio / 1 project

Developing capabilities in mapping, identifying, assessing, inspecting, retrieving and/or neutralising unexploded materials/munition underwater



Facilitating strategic cooperation to ensure the provision of essential services

HORIZON-CL3-2023-INFRA-01-01, IA, €5 Mio / 1 project

Development of tools for EU Member State authorities and operators of infrastructures to assess and anticipate relevant risks to the provisions of essential services. Facilitation of cooperation between Member States authorities as well as on simulation and training for large scale exercises.



Robotics: Autonomous or semi-autonomous UGV systems to supplement skills for use in hazardous environments

HORIZON-CL3-2023-BM-01-02, RIA, €8 Mio / 2 projects

Developing new robotic solutions for specific tasks in disaster response and at the same time addressing specific needs of first responders and taking into account the surrounding environment and factors that impact civil protection on a larger scale.






Cybersecurity Skills Academy


>> Timeline Current Set of Calls
