Disaster-Resilient Societies (DRS) call in Horizon 2020



Challenge

All societal functions are exposed to disasters, whether natural or man-made
It is imperative to act in order to make societies more resilient to the resulting disaster issues

Main objective

- Consider one or more disasters, including from climate-related weather events, earthquakes and volcanic events, space weather events, industrial disasters, crime and terrorism threats
- ☐ Then develop and advance innovations (including organisational processes) in the society, and among first responders
 - o to reduce the loss of human life
 - o to reduce environmental, economic and material damage
 - o and to make the society more resilient to the considered disaster

- Strengthens the involvement of the end-users in project definition and execution
 - o bring together at European level the 'demand' and 'supply' sides

Challenge

A reason for the difficult interaction among practitioners, and for the low levels of interoperability of equipment and procedures implemented by first responders, lies in there being insufficient harmonisation and standardisation, which pre-normative research and demonstrations may address effectively.

Subtopic 3



First aids vehicles deployment, training, maintenance, logistic and remote centralized coordination means

Improved standards and common **communication data exchange** mechanisms are required for an effective deployment of resources during the run-up to a major crisis related to any kind of disaster either natural (including resulting from climate-related extremes) or manmade, and immediately after the event, for example in case of a mass evacuation from an urban area. Proposals should target in particular events where there are **strong cross-sector, cross-border, cross-hierarchy coordination activities** ongoing, and therefore the issue of **interoperability**. The aim is to pave the way to improved standards, including voluntary Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and/or ISO or EN standards.



Impact:

Standards for an effective deployment of resources to respond to major crisis.
