Thematic focuses

- Investigate the potential of unburdening nurses by re-thinking and re-designing current nursing processes
- Develop multiple new and innovative AI (Artificial Intelligence) models based on Real World Data (RWD)
- Empower nurses regarding their professional skills by developing evidence-based digital decision support

Planned realisation and outcomes

The main aim of N!CA is to relieve the burden on nursing staff by optimizing nursing processes and reducing the amount of documentation required and to enable evidence-based decision-making by providing new tools. This should lead to an increase in the job satisfaction of nursing staff and the length of time spent in the nursing profession. Digital solutions for patient engagement, decision support systems for diabetes discharge management and patient self-management are being investigated for feasibility and a decision support system for pain management is being designed. A standardized data format will be developed to create the technical basis for the cross-sectoral use of RWD to develop and validate AI models for personalized risk prediction, semi-automated care assessments and the classification of the need for care through the use of federated learning. The AI models will be evaluated in terms of performance, trustworthiness and usability.
