

#### **Our Mission**



- Identify obstacles: Address concerns on data protection, security, legal or contractual aspects
- **Define services**: Service for public sector Cloud use
- Procure research: Support related research from industry
  - pilots services that improve public sector needs
  - has a risk-benefit sharing through PCP where industry can later commercialize



## **Expected Outcome**



- Public sector in Europe is empowered to procure cost-effective, secure and reliable cloud services
- Procurement terms, do's and dont`s, opportunities and pitfalls are understood
- Industry prepared through the PCP research and experience to meet public sector needs







Services have to fit the following requirements:

- Cross-border trust of cloud providers within Europe
- Enable pan-European cloud market
- Jurisdiction-aware infrastructure (e.g. location of data)
- Security provisioning services (eID, encryption, signature, data protection)
- Data and service portability
- Building trust (cloud certification)



#### Who we are





- CSA-CP for PCP under FP7
- 23 partners from 11 states
- Two main phases:
  - 1. Preparation of the PCP tender (by consortium)
  - Cloud services through joint PCP (from industry)
  - Budget: ~ 13,5 M€ (~ 9,5 M€ for PCP)
- Start date: 1<sup>st</sup> June 2013


