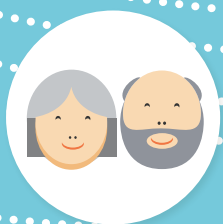

In 2018 the Joint Programming Process (JPP) turns 10 years. Gala Dinner
